COVID-19 Preparedness Plan/2020

DULUTH INDIAN POINT CAMPGROUND (DIPC) is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace for all our Guests and Staff. To ensure that, we have developed the following Preparedness Plan in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This Preparedness Plan follows Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) guidelines and federal OSHA standards related to COVID-19.

PHASED SEASON OPENING PLAN

PHASE-1: June/1 – June/30, 2020

1. **NO** Tent-camping.
2. **Only** self-contained campers (rely on hookups coming to and the facilities within the campers).
3. Bathrooms/Showers are closed.
4. Laundry room is open by appointment only (10AM – 7PM); one camping guest at a time.

At the end of June, the **City of Duluth** will evaluate based on the progress of June camping, then make necessary steps forward.

PHASE-2: July/1, 2020 onward

1. If tent-camping is still suspended, Phase-1 points remain in action, until further notice.
Guests may check back periodically re: the start of tent-camping, by calling the Campground office 218.628.4977.
2. When tent-camping is allowed -- only **one tent** (max. of 5 people) per site. Multiple tents on one site may not be considered. Exception may occur for those of the same household. For clarification, please call Campground office number.

Campers are to RESPECT the following policies and procedures:

a. Hygiene and Respiratory Etiquette

1. Guests are to use protective supplies, such as non-medical **cloth masks, gloves, disinfectant** when entering the store/office areas.
2. Guests to the store/office and other facilities are to **wash/sanitize their hands prior to or immediately upon entering the facilities**. Hand-sanitizer dispensers (that use sanitizers of greater than 60% alcohol) will be available on the check-in counter and can be used for hand hygiene in place of soap and water, as long as hands are not visibly soiled.
3. Handwashing and “Cover Your Cough” signs are posted around the store/office and other facilities within the Campground for guidance. Please refer to them.

b. Administrative Controls for Social Distancing

1. There are **maximum two** Guests, **maintaining six feet of distance** between each other, during check-in and shopping in the store.
2. Only **one family member to check-in**, the rest of the family is to wait in the car/camper. The names and relationship of each person in your group is required when you check-in. You are also to sign the Pet Policy if you have pets during your stay.
3. Guests with campers are to rely on **hookups into their campers**, as well as the use of the **facilities within their campers**. The Campground does have a dump station.
4. Guests coming as a group of campers are to respect hygiene/respiratory etiquette and social-distancing policies when being outside of their campers as a group (enjoying the campfire, playing, chillin’ around, etc. 😊)

c. Housekeeping – Cleaning and Disinfecting

1. Guests are to respect cleanliness and hygiene within the area of their sites →this applies to the picnic table and fire ring, as well as their pets’ business.
